The MHR program in the Jon M. Huntsman School of Business is a full-time, 36- credit program offered at USU's main campus in Logan. Students are typically admitted in August and finish in December of the following year.

In-State Tuition Opportunity

Designated as the Western Regional Graduate Program (WRGP) in Human Resources, residents of Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Wyoming can attend the MHR program at USU for in-state tuition.

Dual Degree Option

Huntsman MHR students have the option of completing an MBA or MMIS as well, thus adding strong general management expertise or technical expertise to the in-depth HR training. With careful scheduling the two programs can be sequenced and completed in 22 months.

Competency-Based Curriculum

The MHR program offers a competency-based curriculum that engages students in real-world projects that enhance their strategic capabilities and experience.

International Experience

In order to prepare future HR professionals for work in the global economy, a 10 to 12 day international experience is conducted in the spring of the first academic year. This trip enables students to experience first-hand the challenges of managing HR across differing political, legal and cultural contexts. In recent years the program has visited cities such as London, Paris, Barcelona, Hannover, Beijing and Shanghai.
